Below is a generic camping checklist. Keep it to use for each campout.

### Camping Checklist

***Make sure all items have your name or a name tag on them!***

Bible
<b>Water bottle with name on it, and some way to carry it!</b>
Sleeping bag – rolled or in a stuff sack
Sleeping pad – insulated is best
Pillow
Chair
Flashlight that works (extra batteries and bulb)
Coat, jacket, fleece (even if it isn't cold when you leave)
Warm hat, gloves or mittens, scarf
Poncho, rain suit or umbrella, rain boots
Casual clothes (jeans, t-shirts, shorts, etc.) for each day <i>(shorts must be modest - prefer as long as the tips of your fingers, or a 5" inseam) (no tank tops for girls)</i>
Club t-shirt (Texas Orange)
Two pairs of shoes (hiking and/or tennis shoes)
Socks and underwear for each day plus one (it is best if they are not cotton socks)
Night clothes
Dirty clothes bag <i>(also garbage bag for wet items)</i>
Personal items (deodorant, lip balm, comb, toothbrush, toothpaste, lotion)
Towel, washcloth, and soap
Wet wipes for cleaning up between showers
If needed: glasses or contacts and solution
Bathing suit - modest (if appropriate for activity) girls must be one-piece or tankini
Hat for sun, sunglasses, bug spray, sunscreen
Notepad and pencil
Daypack for day hikes
Camera (optional)
Toilet paper (in case restrooms are out)
For the Camporee in April – Class A Uniform (Khaki shirt, black pants, sash, scarf, slide, black shoes and socks)
<b>Items to leave at home (unless previous permission given):</b>
Food (this means all snacks! We don't want bears, mice, skunks, or ants in the tents)
Cell phones or electronic devices/games (see Electronics Policy)
