

## Oshkosh Camping List

Here is the checklist for Oshkosh, it's possible that we might have missed something so make sure to think through what you will need. You will need to use a duffle bag (not a suitcase) to pack in.

The club will be providing a sling bag to carry stuff in during the day, you will also receive the aqua, pink, grey and lime green t-shirts once we get there.

***Make sure all items have your name on them, there will be 50,000 people there so without a name, you will for sure lose things. Put tags on your duffle bag, sleeping bag, chair, and sleeping pad.***

Bible
Water bottle with name on it!
Sleeping bag – rolled or in a stuff sack
Sleeping pad
Pillow
Chair (optional for the evening meetings, a tarp will be there if you don't want to bring a chair)
Flashlight that works (extra batteries and bulb)
Coat or jacket, also sweatshirts or fleece
Warm hat, gloves or mittens, scarf (watch the weather before we leave)
Poncho, rain suit or umbrella, rain boots
Casual clothes (jeans, long pants, t-shirts, shorts, etc.) for each day <i>(shorts must be as long as the tips of your fingers) (no tank tops for girls)</i>
Club t-shirt (Texas orange)
Two pairs of shoes (hiking and/or tennis shoes), crocs or flip flops
Socks for each day plus one
Underwear for each day – plus one
Night clothes
Dirty clothes bag <i>(also garbage bag for wet items)</i>
Personal items (deodorant, lip balm, comb, toothbrush, toothpaste, lotion)
Towel, washcloth, soap, shampoo, a few clothespins
Bug spray and sunscreen
Bathing suit - modest girls must be one-piece or tankini with no gap
Hat for sun, sunglasses
Notepad and pencil
Wet wipes for cleaning up between showers
Camera (optional)
Toilet paper (in case restrooms are out)
Class A Uniform – Khaki shirt, black pants, sash, scarf, slide, black shoes and socks
Trading pins and a way to carry them (hat, vest, wash cloth, hand towel). If you have a lot of pins we suggest you only bring the ones that you want to trade.

### **Items to leave at home (unless previous permission given):**

Food (this means snacks! We don't want mice, skunks or ants in the tents). You may bring snacks for the bus ride up.
